What is the Indiana Master Naturalist Program?

The Indiana Master Naturalist (IMN) Program can provide you with many hands-on opportunities to learn about our Hoosier natural resources. It also provides a way for you to share that knowledge, along with your life experiences, through volunteer service to land trusts, soil and water conservation districts, state and local parks, or other natural resource and conservation agencies. The purpose of IMN includes:

- Provide an introduction to Hoosier natural resources through the eyes of resource professionals and experts in the field.
- Provide an educational opportunity to individuals 18 years or older.
- Provide an opportunity for course participants to establish a short or long-term partnership with a natural resources agency or local organization involved in natural resource management by volunteering as a part of the course.

What are the benefits?

Of course, you gain new knowledge of Indiana's plants, wildlife, geology, and geography. You meet other Hoosiers with interests similar to yours. You gain personal satisfaction of "giving back" to your local community through service.

To receive a certificate of completion a student should

- ♦ Participate in at least 80% of the sessions
- ♦ Complete volunteer service with a local or state natural resource organization
- ♦ Complete an open book quiz covering course content (final session − No Makeup)

Those individuals who complete their service hours also receive the following:

- ♦ A certificate of Completion
- An Indiana Master Naturalist pin
